Masonic Education

Rough Ashlars Are Needed in Freemasonry by Elbert Bede. P.M. 33°

Freemasons are inclined to our symbolic ashlars, described in the lecture of the Entered Apprentice Degree, as replicas of material ashlars. Possibly we may take advantage of that inclination and find more than the manual reveals by comparing the functions of the material ashlars with those of the symbolic ashlars of freemasonry.

The rough ashlar is described as a stone in its rude and natural state and we are inclined to believe the principal or only use of the rough ashlar is the comparison with the Perfect Ashlar as made ready for the builder to use. Each Freemason may of course have his own interpretation, but to me the lesson seems to me the Petitioner for the degrees is a Rough Ashlar, that by the application of the teachings of freemasonry the rough portions may be removed and the petitioner, who came to us a rough ashlar, thereby becomes a perfect ashlar; that he should not be content to be less than a perfect ashlar.

All may not accept before going as the most important lesson to be drawn from our references to the ashlars, but it certainly is an important one, and we do indicate in the strongest manner possible that we hope Rough Ashlar whom we receive into the Tyled circle will strive to become a Perfect Ashlar however, possibly we may get just as important lesson, and one with fully as much meaning (certainly with an entirely meaning), by giving attention to the manner in which ashlars, both rough and perfect, are used in construction of a material piece of masonry.

The ashlars, as we use them, according to my interpretation, symbolize humans, members of Fraternity. Do we not have worth brethren of rough exterior? Do we not have worthy brethren of various shapes and sizes, both physically and mentally? Do we not have worth brethren in various stages between the rude and natural state and that of the perfection - which none of us may hope to reach? If all of these are sound in site and of good heart, does not each have a place in the Masonic structure? Does not each have a place in our symbolism?

I interpret "Rude" in its definition of "characterized by ruggedness, stalwart, steady." "Perfection" I interpret coming in later life, after years of study of Freemasonry and related subjects, after ruggedness, stalwartness, and steadiness have given way to the demands of the years with mental embellishment taking there place.


Let us now consider the operative art. Is there not use for ashlar of rough exterior? For ashlar of various sizes? For ashlar in various stages of perfection? Are the old cathedrals erected of perfect ashlar? Or is the skill of the workman tested by the need to use ashlar that are rough and various sizes that must be so mingled in a wall that the wall will rise uprightly, perpendicularly, with the ashlar? The rough and of various sizes of shapes and in different stages approaching perfection must be all knit into a solid mass by the solidifying mortar with the master workman has applied. Is it not true that the exteriors of thousands churches and cathedrals that ashlar of various shapes and sizes were used in their construction? But one thing each ashlar use has in common with all the others; it is sound, it is of good heart.

Let us apply the forgoing to Freemasonry. We need Rough Ashlar of various shapes and sizes. Each Rough Ashlar has a place to fill. Each plays his part in the structure of Freemasonry when all are bound into a solid mass by the cement of Brotherly Love and Affection.

In the operative art the perfect ashlar may have been of the exact width of the wall into which it was fitted. By the use of these perfect or full-width ashlar now (probably called "perpend" ashlar), the rough ashlar of various shapes and sizes were firmly bound together by the same principal we find used when bricks in a wall or other structure are overlapped, giving the best example of cooperation which readily comes to mind. By use at intervals of the perfect exact-width ashlar it is more easily possible to keep the wall to more nearly uniform width.

We need in Freemasonry Perfect Ashlar to aid in binding the mass, to keep us uniform in our conduct as we raise our symbolic Temple in harmony with the teachings of Freemasonry. Possibly a wall could not be raised to great heights without the binding influence of Perfect Ashlar, but the rough Ashlar form the mass. Without them the wall would lack in material.

In Freemasonry, also, we must have the Perfect Ashlar to bind the structure. Without them the structure might crumble, but, without the Rough Ashlar, we should be greatly short of material. The Rough Ashlar has a most important part to play in Freemasonry.
