

US HOUSE RESOLUTION REGARDING FREEMASONRY

On Jan 5, 2007 Rep. Paul Gilmore (Ohio) introduced a Resolution before the Congress of the United States, as follows:

Whereas the Masonic Fraternity is deserving of formal recognition of their long history of care-giving for the citizenry and their example of high moral standards; and

Whereas Freemasons have always celebrated St. John's Day, June 24, as dedicated to their patron saints:

Now, therefore, be it resolved, That the House of Representatives recognizes the thousands of Freemasons in every State in the Nation and honors them for their many contributions to the Nation throughout its history.
