



The 47th Problem

I want to share with you, an abbreviated version of a very excellent Short Talk Bulletin, written by Brother Rev. Joseph Fort Newton that was titled, "The 47th Problem." I am also taking the liberty to add some of my own research.

Brother Newton begins as follows:

"Containing more real food for thought and impressing on the receptive mind, a greater truth than any other of the emblems of the sublime degree, the 47th Problem of Euclid, generally, gets less attention, and certainly less, than all the rest. Just why this should receive so little explanation in our lecture and just how it has happened, that although the Fellow Craft degree makes so much of Geometry, geometry's right hand should be so cavalierly treated, is not for the present inquiry to settle."

Our single reference to the Masonic Legend of Euclid is very old. Just how old, we do not know, but it long antedates the Master Mason Degree. It was Thomas Webb Smith, who, in his first edition of the "Freemason's Monitor or

Illustrations of Masonry", first published in 1797, wrote and preserved for us this familiar paragraph.

"The 47th Problem of Euclid", was an invention of our ancient friend and brother, the great Pythagoras, who in his travels through Asia, Africa, and Europe, was initiated into several orders of priesthood and was also raised to the sublime degree of Master. This wise philosopher enriched his mind abundantly, in a general knowledge of things and more especially in geometry. On this subject, he drew out many problems and theorems, and among the most distinguished, he erected this, when in the joy of his heart, he exclaimed "Eureka", in the Greek language signifying "I have found it" and upon the discovery of which is said to have sacrificed a hecatomb. It teaches Masons to be general lovers of the arts and sciences."




In this one paragraph are mentioned two of the most important mathematicians of all time, Euclid, and Pythagoras.

It also carries with it some truths, half-truths, and some just plain poetic license. Smith only preserved what someone else had written and we don't know who that someone was, or when they wrote it. Even in Anderson's Constitutions, which was published in 1723, he mentions that:

"The greater Pythagoras provided the author of the 47th Proposition of Euclid's first book, which, if duly observed, is the Foundation of all Masonry, sacred, civil, and military."

With that being said, let's start with Pythagoras. History records that Pythagoras was born on the Greek island of Samos around 570 B.C.E. and lived until around 490 B.C.E. He established a society with philosophical, religious, and political aims. Shrouded in secrecy, they believed that only by truly understanding the universe could one achieve salvation of the soul, and as Divinity created all things, studying it over a period of several lifetimes could bring one closer to Divinity itself. As such, it was believed that only through study and reason could one start to understand Divinity. To him, reason is based on measurable things, such as through numbers and objects, it becomes easier to understand. Therefore, his society devoted much time to the study of mathematics and particularly the study of geometry. Pythagoras is known to have traveled but was probably confined to the countries bordering the Mediterranean. He did go to Egypt, but it is improbable that he went further than into Asia Minor. The 47th Problem is attributed to him, but it can't be proven that he was the first to discover it, but he worked on it so much that it was called the Pythagoras Problem. If he did discover it, and because he was Greek, he may have exclaimed Eureka. The fact that he sacrificed a hecatomb is entirely out of character on several counts. The Pythagoreans were vegetarians and reverenced all animal life. They believed all souls first lived in animals and then in man, so a sacrifice



is probably mythical. On top of that, he probably wasn't wealthy or foolish enough to slaughter one hundred head of cattle.

It is thought the application of the mathematical usage of the right angle was something he may have observed while in Egypt. It was the application of th knotted rope. To produce a right angle of ninety-degrees, they used a rope with twelve equally spaced knots. When they laid out the rope using the first three knots, turning, and laying out the next four, then turning again, bringing the twelfth knot to the first, a right angle was formed. Pythagoras's problem was to prove why.

It was Euclid, two hundred years later, who immortalized Pythagoras's theorem and its solution. Euclid, also a Greek, was born around 325 B.C.E. As a youth he was probably educated in Plato's school in Athens. As a young man, he moved to the academically rich environment of Alexandria and later taught in the school there. He started compiling mathematical problems and proofs from Pythagoras and many other Greek mathematicians, strengthening their logic where it may have been weak and adding his own proofs, which produced works of stunning intellectual power. His goal was to discover eternal and universal truths. He allowed himself only the tools of a builder and a mason, a straight edge, and a compass.

Starting with a few self-evident principles, Euclid deduced and provided many increasingly sophisticated theorems. He decided to compile all the mathematical theorems and proofs together. In total, he wrote thirteen volumes of books, which were titled the "Elements." Each book contained many geometric propositions and explanations, in total four hundred sixty-five problems. In book number one, the last two problems, forty-seven and forty-eight, were by Pythagoras. It was Euclid who wrote about it, but it was Pythagoras who discovered or at least solved and codified it. Upon the invention of moveable print and Gutenberg's press in 1450, the "Elements" first printing was in 1482 and to date, it is second only to the Bible in the numbers printed.

Pythagoras's theorem of A squared plus B squared equals C squared produces a ninety-degree angle at the juncture of A and B, and is, in our universe, true. True means absolute and never changing. Considering this, the invention of our ancient friend and brother, the great Pythagoras, becomes one of the most impressive and important emblems of Freemasonry, the square. It is for us, the symbol of the power, the wisdom, and the goodness of the Great Architect of the Universe.


Joint Installtion of Officers
